SYNOPSIS

The OBSTACLES TO GRACE talk, is meant to give the candidates a sense of the realism about the difficulties they may encounter in living a personal relationship with Christ; also, to encourage them, that God in us and with us can triumph over every obstacle.

I. Introduction

- A. <u>Life in Grace is God's plan</u> of living the perfect Ideal (Rollo #12 so only a brief reference, please)
- B. Recognize grace in life as God's gift to us because He loves us through Jesus. In Jesus we are given the gift of salvation from sin, and we receive our true potential as God's workmanship created for good works (Eph. 2:8-10).
- C. The obstacles are anything that gets in the way or hinders us from living that full and true potential.
- D. The good news is that no matter what the obstacles, God keeps His promises (Lamentations 3:22,23).

II. Definition of Obstacles to Grace

Anything which stands between God and us, and that hinders or keeps us from enjoying all that God has for us in Jesus Christ

- B. / That which keeps us from meeting God's ideal
- C. Anything that prevents the flow of God's grace through us

III. Basic Obstacle is Sin

- A. In the beginning God gave life.
 - 1. Humanity deliberately rebelled by choosing a way of life different than and contrary to God's way of life. Gen. 3
 - a. The way of disobedience was chosen.
 - b. Result: humanity falls short of the glory of God. Rom. 3:23 This is a missing of the mark, a falling short of the
 - ideal.
 - 2. Our human nature is now corrupted by sin.
 - a. Our sin-affected nature commits sins -- thoughts, words and deeds.
 - b. We sin because we are sinners.
- B. We receive death because we have inherited sin.
 - 1. The wages of sin is death Romans 6:23
 - 2. Death is separation from God Matt. 25:30,41
- C. Sin affects every dimension of our lives.
 - 1. Our human nature/person
 - a. Our heart becomes self-centered refusing piety
 - b. Our mind rejects truth and refuses study
 - c. Our body chooses disobedience and rejects service
 - 2. Our relationships
 - a. With God we refuse to submit to Him
 - b. With others we refuse to love them and care for them
 - c. With self we refuse what is best and have low self-
 - d. With nature we abuse God's world and fail to keep it for Him
